## Incident: Abbotsford Police launch new drone

The Abbotsford Police introduced its newest tool today - an unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV), also known as a "drone".

The drone, a Matrice 210C Transport Canada Compliant Aircraft, was generously donated by the Abbotsford Police Foundation. It will be used for aerial photography of serious motor vehicle collisions, outdoor crime scenes, search and rescue, disaster recovery, and for tactical purposes when necessary. The drone may also be used to view fires and assist with natural disaster response and recovery.

Chief Rich said, "Within a few days of getting this drone up and running, we deployed it to assist in two accident investigations. We so appreciate having this new equipment to use to improve our response to critical incidents."



Currently, the Abbotsford Police's one UAV pilot is Cst. Rob Hryhorczuk, a private pilot who previously flew small fixed-wing aircraft. By this fall, the Department anticipates having three

## About the Matrice:

The Matrice 210 C is controlled using a CrystalSky monitor tablet, carries a regular camera and uses forward-looking infrared technology. Camera views can be switched instantly. The Matrice is water resistant and is able to fly in a wide variety of environments. The propeller-driven aircraft weighs only 3.8 kilograms, and can fly for up to 38 minutes at a time over an operating range of 7 km.
