Incident: UPDATE: Cat Burglar caught! Thomas PAPPAS in custody

Abbotsford Police Major Crime detectives have identified and arrested 53–year-old Thomas Michael PAPPAS in connection with last month's disturbing break and enter in which a woman awoke to find an unknown male in her residence, standing by her bed.

Thomas PAPPAS remains in custody, facing a charge of breaking and entering into a dwelling house.

Initial Release – April 18, 2018

On April 5, 2018, Abbotsford Police patrol officers responded to a report of a break and enter in the 30500 block of Cardinal Avenue. The complainant advised that she woke at 11:30 pm to find an unknown male in her bedroom, standing by her bed. The male fled when the woman awoke and screamed. The woman was unable to provide a suspect description as it was dark. Police patrols and a K9 search did not locate a suspect at that time.

Major Crime detectives have reviewed CCTV, collected witness statements and conducted neighbourhood canvasses; however, we are requesting anyone that may have information about this incident to please contact the Abbotsford Police Department.

- Use door chains and spy holes to give you extra security if someone knocks on your door. Never be afraid to turn people away. If you have concerns about anyone who has come to your door call the police; If you are going to be away, have a neighbour or friend pick up your mail and flyers; Use timers to control lighting within the home;
- Consider installing home alarm system and use vehicle anti-theft devices/vehicle alarm systems.

The Abbotsford Police Department would like to remind our residents to please report any suspicious vehicles, activity or behaviour, such as someone showing up at your home "mistakenly" looking for a different address, or going through yards of neighbours who you believe are away.
