### Incident: 3 Vehicle Collision on South Parallel Road

**Abbotsford – December 14, 2010.**

This afternoon at 4:30 pm a 1988 Toyota SUV, that was traveling eastbound in the 38000 block of South Parallel Road, collided with a 2004 Honda Civic that exited from a driveway and attempted to turn left (westbound). The result of the collision was that the Honda was positioned across both lanes of traffic. Several witnesses attended the scene and attempted to provide assistance to the driver of the Honda. A 1989 Dodge truck approached the scene westbound on South Parallel Road. The Dodge collided with a male and female who were on foot near the driver's door. The pair were thrown into a nearby ditch. The Dodge then impacted the Honda with the driver still inside.

The female pedestrian, who suffered serious injuries, was transported to hospital via air ambulance. The male pedestrian and the female driver of the Honda were transported by ground ambulance with non life threatening injuries.

Abbotsford Police patrol division officers and collision reconstructionists continue to investigate the collision. All of the drivers were cooperative, remained on scene and were sober.
