Incident: Abbotsford Police begin Marihuana Enforcement Project

Abbotsford – November 3, 2011.

The Abbotsford Police Department has launched a new initiative – the Marihuana Enforcement Project - aimed at continuing to make the city a lousy place for gangsters and drug dealers to live and ply their trade. The APD will now focus Patrol Division resources, under the guidance and leadership of a Drug Enforcement Unit member, toward eliminating illegal marihuana grow operations in the community. These grow operations present many public safety risks and provide financing for gangs and organized crime. The product and the profit obtained through grow operations is often exchanged for harder drugs, weapons and used to feed the expansion of the criminal group.

As with our previous anti-gang endeavours, the success of the Marihuana Enforcement Project is dependent on the support of the community. We want to ensure that citizens have options to share their concerns with the APD about grow operations in their neighbourhood or any information they may have which will further this public safety initiative.
