The Abbotsford Police Department has confirmed the residency of Don Michel BAKKER to a location within the city of Abbotsford. APD officers have attended this residence and have spoken with BAKKER. We have also heard from many concerned citizens.


Public safety is the Abbotsford Police Department's highest priority. We previously shared information about BAKKER because we believe that the citizens of Abbotsford have a right to be informed when exceptional circumstances such as these arise. We again emphasize that people should familiarize themselves with BAKKER's photo, background and court ordered conditions in order that they can protect their families and assist the APD.

Today we are providing our citizens with a map that encompasses BAKKER's current residence location. The area highlighted includes the boundaries of George Ferguson Way, Old Yale Road, Sumas Way/Highway 11 By-pass and Gladys Avenue. Abbotsford Police Sex Offender Public Notification



Original Public Notification of August 1, 2012

Don Michel BAKKER, age 48, is the subject of a public notification conducted by the Abbotsford Police Department.

BAKKER is 5'6" tall and weighs 155 lbs, with brown hair and brown eyes.

BAKKER may be residing in, and frequenting, the Abbotsford area.

BAKKER was convicted of 10 sexual offences. His victims were women and children. His attacks were extremely violent and targeted vulnerable persons.

BAKKER is subject to the following conditions:

No contact, direct or indirect, with anyone under the age of 18.

Not to attend public parks or public swimming areas where persons under 18 years of age could reasonably be expected to be present.

No contact with sex trade workers.

Not to possess any electronic device that connects to the internet.

Not to possess any weapons as defined by the Criminal Code or any tool or device that can be used for restraint.

Abide by a curfew of 11:00 pm to 6:00 am.
